



Black Hill Primary School Uniform Policy

PURPOSE:

This policy specifies the dress code and presentation standards for all students attending Black Hill Primary School.

AIMS:

To provide a dress code that:

- Promotes equality amongst all students;
- Establishes a sense of belonging within our students;
- Clearly identifies students as representatives of Black Hill Primary;
- Our students can wear with pride;
- Meets or exceeds the health and safety standards, especially with respect to Sunsmart; and
- Is cost effective, practical and appropriate for all school activities and weather conditions.

IMPLEMENTATION:

Uniform:

- Navy blue shorts, track suit pants or skorts
- Navy blue and white chequered school dress or navy blue pinafore
- Navy blue tights (not leggings)
- Navy blue, black, grey or white socks
- Logoed Polo shirt (short or long sleeved)
 - Gold – years prep through four
 - Navy blue – years five and six
- Logoed Jumpers (windcheaters or polar fleece)
 - Navy blue – years prep through four
 - Navy blue with three horizontal gold stripes – years five and six
- Navy blue rain jacket
- Black school shoes or plain black or navy blue runners

Note: A year six commemorative jumper may be worn by a year six student in lieu of the logoed jumper.

Presentation Standards:

- Hair;
 - Long hair must be tied back.
 - Hair ties, ribbons, etc. must be coloured black, navy blue, yellow or gold.
 - Extreme hair colours (green, pink, purple, etc.) and styles (dread locks, Mohawks, etc.) are not permitted unless for special theme days.
- Jewellery;
 - Watches, stud or sleeper earrings, bracelets and necklaces may be worn.
 - Students should remove jewellery prior to physical or sporting activities.
 - Facial jewellery is not permitted.
 - Students must remove jewellery items when requested by staff.
- Cosmetics;
 - Clear nail polish may be worn;

- Facial cosmetics (lipstick, eye shadow, etc.) and coloured nail polish must not be worn.
- Hats:
 - Broad brimmed or bucket sun hats, consistent with our Sunsmart policy, must be worn outdoors until the end of April and from the start of September.
 - Caps and Beanies may be worn from May through to August.
 - Students are not permitted to wear hats inside

Diversity:

- Black Hill Primary School encourages and respects diversity and acknowledges that this policy may not be suitable for: all religious beliefs; ethnic or cultural expectations; students with special needs; or students with specific health conditions.
- Parents may seek an exemption to part or all of this policy by writing to School Council.

EVALUATION:

This policy is to be reviewed as part of the school's three-year review cycle.
