- Set a good example at all times and be a positive role model for all students at Black Hill Primary School, modelling the school values of Resilience, Responsibility, and Respect.
- Always be a friendly, respectful and caring person that other children can talk to and get assistance from in the schoolyard.
- Acknowledge students who show kindness and display our school values in the schoolyard.
- Model and demonstrate safe and appropriate games to play within the yard.
- Remind students of our yard behaviour expectations.
- Use affective statements to help remind students of the appropriate behaviour.
- Inspect the yard regularly for any dangers and report these to the Assistant Principal.
- Analyse feedback from the student attitudes towards school survey data about school connectedness and make recommendations for school improvement.
- Attend a special luncheon as a group at the end of the year to celebrate achievements.

On your allocated day you will:

1. Collect waist bag and wear a fluorescent vest so children can identify you in the yard.
2. Walk around the school grounds, making yourself available to help the students and teachers.
3. Write nominations for the Values badges and record the yard duty booklet
4. Report any problems you identify in the yard to the yard duty teachers.
5. Report any safety issue to the Assistant Principal.
6. Return the vest and bag to the First Aid room for the next day's mentors.

Application Process

Selected current student leaders will discuss the expectations of the leadership roles within the school and their job description outlining the selection process on the Blueprint.

Candidates write a letter to Steve indicating their expression of interest in the position. These are to be given directly to Mrs Westlake. **(Applications close Monday 28th October at 10:00am)**

Between Wednesday 6th November and Friday 29th November

Selected candidates may require an interview and/or role play scenario with Steve. The following points are considered before a decision is made:

- a) the student's letter of expression of interest,
- b) teachers' perception of suitability for the role via voting and
- c) Compass Chronicle entries.

Letters to successful and unsuccessful candidates will be sent home **Monday 2nd December.**

Student leadership positions will be announced formally at assembly on **Friday 6th December at 2:45pm.**

An induction of all student leaders and badges will be presented at assembly within the first weeks of 2025.

Please note: From your written application the panel will make a shortlist of students who fulfil the key requirements of a student leadership role:

- Model the School Values
- Wear correct uniform at all times

Students will be notified in writing of the outcome of their applications. (Not all students who apply for positions will be chosen to conduct speeches to the school community or be interviewed).

If you are also applying for other positions, number your preferences by putting 1 for the most important to you, 2 for the next, and so on in the preference column.

Please do not number/apply for more than 4 positions.
